- What is the most unsafe thing you or your family have done?

2. Discussion Questions

- What are the things or who are the people we try to find security in outside of our relationship with Christ? Why do we look to them rather than to Christ?
- Read Colossians 1:27 – How would you rephrase this verse in your own words?
- If the Gospel says, “We want you to come as you are but not stay as you are;” then, how are you different now compared to before you accepted the Gospel?
- What practices do you have in place to make sure you don’t stay as you are now?
- Read Colossians 1:28, Hebrews 5:12-14 & Ephesians 4:11-16
 - What does spiritual maturity look like?
 - What’s our role in becoming mature?
 - What’s our role in helping other people become mature?
 - What is God’s role in developing our maturity?
- Read Colossians 2:6-7 – Paul lists four things for us to continue in: being rooted, built up, strengthened, and overflowing. Which one of these do you want to focus on for your next step to continue living in Christ?

Extra Scriptures

Leaders: Don't feel like you need to use any, and certainly not all, of the following. These are just available if you'd like some more content to spark further discussion or understanding.

- **1 Corinthians 2:7** We declare God's wisdom, a mystery that has been hidden and that God destined for our glory before time began.
- **Ephesians 3:6** This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.
- **Philippians 2:9-11** Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
- **Philippians 3:7-8** But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ
- **Hebrews 1:3** The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.
- **2 Peter 1:3** His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.
- **Revelation 1:18** Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
